Course Coordinator Position:

Clinical Teaching Role:

Create and maintain clinical partnerships within the community to facilitate the best student clinical experiences. Clinical placements utilized include: acute care inpatient, outpatient primary care health clinics,

Philosophy of Teaching: The Pursuit of Excellence

Nursing is an art: and if it is to be made an art, it requires an exclusive devotion as hard a preparation, as any painter's or sculptor's work; for what is the having to do with dead canvas or dead marble, compared with having to do with the living body, the temple of God's spirit? It is one of the Fine Arts: I had almost said, the finest of Fine Arts. ~Florence Nightingale

My philosophy of nursing education is based on the central tenet that the fields of nursing and education are both an art and a science which require devotion to the perpetual quest for mastery, knowing that mastery will never be fully achieved. Our own mastery of nursing is influenced by the scientific framework of evidence based practice, and the pursuit of excellence within those boundaries.

Learning is a complex process and a perpetually evolving science with many interacting variables that influence it. Learning can occur within many environmental contexts, but the setting should be rich and diverse. It is my goal to engage students in experiential collaborative learning opportunities that are meaningful. Collaborative learning consists of explorative conversation, an awareness of self, and relationships that foster a sense of community. My goal is to link the environmental and social variables outside the classroom and the knowledge acquired within that setting. It is essential for learning to be student centered. The teacher-learner relationship is enriched by a mutually respectful, caring, trusting and collaborative spirit where students and teacher all learn from each other. Learners should press each other on to increasing independence, knowledge of self, and the appreciation of the art and science of nursing.

Learning can be enhanced when there is an environment of shared responsibility and growth on both a personal and community level. When I connect with my students in partnership and engage in open and explorative dialogue, acting as a guide and co-learner rather than merely an instructor, I empower my students to discover their potential in the transformation of healthcare. As a teacher, I feel the responsibility to construct a bridge upon which my students may use to connect to service within the community. Clinical learning can only be translated into real nursing care within the context of society.

I must use my expertise in pediatric nursing to equip students with the necessary resources to be lifelong students of child health. The responsibility of a pediatric nurse is to literally care for the future of the world. Caring is the very heart of nursing and is a way of being with students, patients, and other health professions. Caring is born through life experience and can be nurtured in a learning environment that encourages caring practices in any setting. My philosophical views on caring and nursing have been influenced by Jean Watson and Hildegard Peplau.

The role of professional nursing practice must be ever growing to meet the changing needs of society. This growth can be enhanced by connecting to professional nursing organizations, through which knowledge is enhanced and burgeoning of the profession can be achieved. I believe that as a nurse educator, it is my duty to keep pace with these changes and to infuse new concepts into the educational preparation of nurses in order to foster the creation of competent professionals who care about their patients and will be awakened to meet the challenges of the future in nursing. The critical essence of nursing education is to provide a caring, supportive, and collaborative environment that encourages the emergence of new ideas, the generation of creativity, and the maturation of clinical reasoning. If nurses experience this kind of educational experience, it is my belief they will seek to replicate it within their service both to their community and to their profession.
